I have been advised that I do not have to make this or any other statement, and that what I say can be used against me in a Court of Law. I have been advised that I have the right to Counsel with an Attorney of my choice, that if I am financially unable to obtain an Attorney the Court will appoint an Attorney to represent me. I have not been threatened or promised any reward to make this statement and do so voluntarily. I understand I have the right to stop at any time. I hereby waive these rights.

I am 18 years old and reside at 318 Doughtit Street in Greenville SC

I have known Charles Wakefield for about 4 or 3 years. I knew him from the street. On the night before the Loopers were killed, back in Jan of this year, me and Charles had been out getting high off some money that I had. We were getting high off reefer and wine and we were going to different places and mostly liquor houses and that morning, ; it was coming day light and we went to my house and we couldn't get in and then we went to a liquor house over on Pack Street and then we went to this dudes house named Doug and Charles stayed there awhile and they talked and after that me and Wakefield left. We messed around West Greenville for awhile and we started to go and get some more wine. Wakefield was talking about some places and he was wanting to rob a liquor store at the Bilo Store on Pendleton Street. Wakefield had 32 cal pistol; the gun was dark colored with light colored handles. We walked around West Greenville for awhile and we was kinda looking over some places to rob and we walked by the Looper garage in West Greenville and Wakefield went down toward the place close then I did and he was looking and checking the place out and he came back and we were walking some more and he had told me that he didn't see but one dude in there. We hung around West Greenville for about 5 or 10 minutes and thats when we went back. We stopped right in front of the place and he told me to go on up the street and watch out because I told him that I wouldn't go in there. I walked up to the old ice plant and a few steps above the place on the side walk and I saw him go into the Looper Garage and I saw a woman and I could tell that she had on some kind of uniform and a little hat but I was panicked like everything and then he stayed longer than I tought it would take and I was so scared that when he came out; I saw him run out and I didn't wait and I started running and then he caught up with me running and it was right in front of my door and we went into my house and we smoked the rest of the reefer and played records and Wakefield counted out \$55 on my Mothers coach and I complained the amount he gave me and he told me that I didn't do nothing to earn it. We talked some more and he told me that he was wanting to go to the Ganna and I asked him what made him stay in the garage so long and Wakefield said " I had to go thru a few changes, I had to kill up a few mother fuckers". I thought he was lying and later he left. The next day, I heard from everybody about the people getting killed at the garage and I got scared and stayed at home and about a week later this guy that I don't know came to me and told me that he wanted to talk to me about Charles and I told him that I didn't have nothing to say. He left and I had to leave to keep him from jumping on me. I ran from him actually. ; and went
